## REGIONAL LEADERS



**GABRIEL BORIC**  
**PRESIDENT OF CHILE**

Gabriel Boric was elected president of Chile in March 2022. In 2009, Boric began his career as a student leader. Between 2010 and 2011, he served as a university senator at the University of Chile, and in 2012 he assumed the presidency of the Federation of Students of the University of Chile (Fech). In March 2014, he was elected deputy for Magallanes District 60.



**XIOMARA CASTRO**  
**PRESIDENT OF HONDURAS**

Xiomara Castro was inaugurated as president of Honduras in January 2022. Castro is the first female president in the country's history, having previously served as first lady from 2006 to 2009 during the presidency of her husband, Manuel Zelaya. In the presidential elections of 2013 and 2021, she was selected as Libre's presidential candidate.



**ALBERTO FERNÁNDEZ**  
**PRESIDENT OF ARGENTINA**

Alberto Fernández has been President of Argentina since December 10, 2019. Previously he held the positions of director of Summaries/Proceedings and deputy director-general of Legal Affairs of the Ministry of Economy during the presidency of Raúl Alfonsín. Fernández was superintendent of Insurance between 1989 and 1995, and was the founder and first executive vice president of the BAPRO Group between 1995 and 2000. In August 2000, he was elected legislator for the Autonomous City of Buenos Aires. Between 2003 and 2008, he served as chief/head of the Cabinet of Ministers.



**GUILLERMO LASSO**  
**PRESIDENT OF ECUADOR**

Guillermo Lasso was inaugurated as president of Ecuador in May 2021. In 2011, he received an Honorary Doctorate from the Universidad de las Américas for his professional career and achievements. President Lasso founded Ecuador Libre, an Ecuadorian think tank that seeks to promote individual freedom, justice, the free market, private property, and the rule of law. Lasso founded Ecuador's Creating Opportunities (CREO) Party, for which he was a presidential candidate during the Ecuadorian general elections in 2013 and 2017.

**WORLD BANK'S VICE PRESIDENT FOR THE LATIN AMERICA AND THE CARIBBEAN REGION**

Carlos Felipe Jaramillo is the World Bank's vice president for the Latin America and the Caribbean Region, overseeing Bank relations with 31 countries. Under his leadership, the Bank's operations in the region focus on fueling growth, reducing poverty, supporting equality, and protecting the environment.
